# PREPARED BUILDING TENNESSEE'S FUTURE WORKFORCE

**SIXTEEN YEARS AGO, THE FOUNDERS OF KNOXACHIEVES JUMPED IN WITH BOTH FEET.** At the time, mayors Mike Ragsdale and Bill Haslam opened doors. Businessmen Randy Boyd, Rich Ray and Tim Williams secured funding. And together, we created a mission-centered, business-minded nonprofit dedicated to serving students and moving the college access and completion needles. Knowing our founders meant we were destined for BIG impact, but I cannot imagine any of us ever dreamed our now decade-long statewide organization would soon **GRADUATE 50,000 COLLEGE STUDENTS** and serve as a vital cog in Tennessee's workforce development engine.

I often say tnAchieves' success lies in a simple but magical equation. First, we listen to our students. What are they telling us they need to find success? Then, we add data. Are we moving the needle for ALL students, and if not, where are our gaps? Following this, we ask ourselves if tnAchieves is uniquely positioned to construct a program that BOTH serves students and drives impact. If the answer is yes, then we work to imagine, build, constantly refine and measure programs designed specifically to increase Tennessee's college going and college completion rates. Our end goal is to arm more students with the degrees and credentials necessary to launch high-quality careers with economic mobility.

We know our students are more **PREPARED** for the high-demand, high-wage jobs offered across Tennessee.

tnAchieves offers a comprehensive approach to building Tennessee's future workforce. It is often said but also true, "There are no silver bullets in education." It takes a multi-pronged approach to ensure our students enroll in the college (community, technical or four-year institution) that is the right fit and earn a workforce-aligned credential that serves them and their communities.

Our **VOLUNTEER MENTORS** matter. **COMPLETE** and **COMPLETE GRANTS** matter. Pilots like **KNOX ACCESS** and **TRANSFER** matter. **SUMMER PROGRAMS** matter.

#### IT ALL MATTERS.

Not only does it matter but it leads to increased college access and completion. And more importantly, it builds a more prepared Tennessee workforce.

I continue to be thankful for our partnerships across the state, our board and its

vision, our students and families and the team I feel so grateful to work alongside every day. SIXTEEN YEARS STRONG AND WE ARE JUST GETTING STARTED.







### **IMPACT: ACCESS**

tnAchieves programs are designed to connect students with high-quality post-secondary opportunities that lead to gainful employment. As a partner in the development of Tennessee's talent pipeline, it is critical that programs are effectively supporting students to and through college.

#### TENNESSEE'S COLLEGE-GOING RATE

Tennessee's college-going rate represents the number of high school seniors pursuing college after graduation. With a statewide scope, tnAchieves uses the college-going rate as a measure of success for college access programs.



Spun into decline by the COVID-19 pandemic, Tennessee's college-going fell in 2020 and 2021. With a statewide scope and impact, tnAchieves has worked proactively to reverse declining enrollment trends by helping counties establish local college-going rate goals and hosting college-application blitzes.

### COMMUNITY-BASED COLLEGE-GOING RATE GOALS



70% by 2024 is an initiative to align Knox County Schools, local colleges and community partners behind the idea that college is for all.

More than 70 businesses and organizations pledged their support of this effort, inspiring the launch of Knox Access, a proactive college access coaching pilot in Knox County.



70% by 2025 is a student-focused effort led by the Roane Alliance and the Roane County Executive meant to inspire students to pursue a high-quality post-secondary credential.





"Focusing first on associate degree attainment in three years, our primary outcome of interest, we find that students who had at least three coaching contacts (high engagement) were 10.3 percentage points more likely to attain an associate degree in three years relative to students who were offered reactive coaching.

Among treatment group students who had at least three coaching contacts, estimated impacts were positive and statistically significant for all outcome measures except for certificate completion."




### **COMPLETE GRANTS**

### PILOT PROGRAMS

### **KNOX ACCESS**

tnAchieves developed an innovative, local response to declining college-going rates and widening gaps through Access Programs. Spun into decline by the COVID-19 pandemic, Tennessee's college-going rate dropped nine percentage points from 2019-2021.

While post-pandemic data has stabilized, tnAchieves believes a targeted, proactive college access model is needed to return our state's college-going rate to pre-pandemic levels. The goal of tnAchieves access programs is simple: Increase college access opportunities for ALL high school graduates.

### **TRANSFER**

Although **67**% of TN Promise students indicate intentions to transfer from community college to a four-year institution, only **24**% successfully make the transition. To improve this transfer rate, tnAchieves has identified students who intend to transfer and help facilitate a successful transition.

### PILOT SUCCESS

83% of participating students have transferred, graduated or are still enrolled at a community college.

### SUMMER PROGRAMS

More than half of TN Promise students are considered academically at-risk. With many of these students needing additional support in reading, English and math, tnAchieves offers free summer programs designed to propel students into their first semester by eliminating the need for remediation and boosting their confidence to reach their full potential. In addition to daily instruction, students participate in lunch and learn sessions that focus on leadership, community involvement and college success.

Offered the summer before college enrollment, tnAchieves hosts two summer programs for academically at-risk students at community colleges throughout the state:

### **SUMMER BRIDGE**

Hosted at all Tennessee community colleges, Summer Bridge is a 14-day program where students review reading, English and math and complete the Accuplacer exam. Successful students eliminate the need for learning support and begin college more prepared.

### **SUMMER INSTITUTE**

Hosted at Southwest Tennessee Community College, Summer Institute is a six-week program placing students in credit-bearing and learning support courses. Successful students finish the program with 9 college credits and eliminate the need for learning support.






